Australian Healthcare - Hospitals





- Public & Private Hybrid
 - ~700 Public Hospitals
 - ~660 Private (incl day facilities)
- Public is funded Federally but managed at State, then Local Health District, and further at Individual facility
- Private is funded by a mixture of private insurance and public funding (largely reimbursement based)
- Small number of Public/Private partnerships



Australian Healthcare – (not) Hospitals





- ~2700 Residential Aged Care homes, managed by 845 providers (most are privately owned and managed)
- ~5700 Community Pharmacies, all privately owned, largely by individuals though some are parts of franchises
- '000's Community Care organisations, Allied Health, General Practitioners, Specialist (Consultants)
- 31 Primary Health Networks (independent organisations, funded through grants from federal government)



Australian Healthcare – (not) Hospitals





- National Health Record summary
- (Some) states have Single Patient Records (Hospital only)
- Immunisation Register now linked to National Health Record
- Standards landscape within digital health includes FHIR (HL7), Snomed, ISBT-128/ICCBBA
- Scanning is mandatory for dispensing of medicines and uses a linkage between Snomed & GS1 within this process
