




Medicines, Medical Equipment, and other Supply Chain account for 62% of **NHS Carbon Footprint**

137 days (median ave)

400 days (worst example)

## What is also missing? End-to-end visibility




# Buying Inventory and allowing it go out of date is NOT Sustainable

- Majority of inventory in hospitals continues to rely on manual order processes
- We (Hospitals and Industry) do not share data on demand and stock availability

Adoption of GS1 standards provides a key enabler

### New Focus: Return back to Single Use



10 million operations performed each Year in the NHS

### New Focus: Devices moving out of the Hospital



**Digital Inequality?** 

Lambeth: 59%

**Bromley: 45%** 

Devices likely to be increasingly provided by Industry or the NHS to address barrier of digital inequality

# More Assets increases the case for asset tracking inside and outside of the Hospital

The case to invest in asset tracking:

GSTT (2018)

14% (£658k) of Equipment Library assets replaced every year

39% (£1.2m) of Equipment Assets unable to be located

# Buying an asset and losing it, and so having to buy a replacement asset is NOT Sustainable

 Majority of hospital equipment continues to rely on paper based systems to track assets

Adoption of GS1 standards provides a key enabler
